V. Florida Department of Corrections (FDC), Office of Health Services (OHS) Report-Laura Carter, Chief of Health Services Administration

• Centurion of Florida's health services contract was amended to extend for an additional three years. The contract began July 1, 2019. Additionally, the contract amendment included a provision for Centurion to develop an electronic medical record (EMR). The anticipated date for the EMR to be implemented is June 2020.
