# V. Florida Department of Corrections (FDC), Office of Health Services (OHS) Report-Tom Reimers, Director of Health Services

- The Department's Health Services contract is still being negotiated. Negotiations for mental health services have been completed and RMC negotiations are set to begin. OHS's goal is to present the Department's recommendations for the Health Services to the Legislature in January.
- The Department is in mediation with Disability Rights Florida
- Mr. Reimers provided a summary of the Department's response to the emergency notification at SFRC. Following the emergency notification, the Department gave notice to change contractors.
- During the legislative session, 10% pay increases were approved for officers working in mental health inpatient units.
- Dr. Dean Aufderheide provided an update regarding the Department's plan to open a 600bed mental health augmented services program at Wakulla Annex.

• Ms. Love reported on the transition of Region IV institutions over to Centurion and managing the emergency notification at SFRC.
