VI. Florida Department of Management Services (DMS), Bureau of Private Prison Monitoring Report-Neil Morris, Chief

• Mr. Morris provided an overview of DMS's Private Prison Monitoring Program. He discussed the program's organizational structure and monitoring process for health services contracts.

VII. Florida Department of Corrections (FDC), Office of Health Services (OHS) Report-Tom Reimers, Health Services Director

- Dr. Watkins-Ferrell provided a status update regarding OHS's monitoring of mental health services at Union Correctional Institution and corrective action plan (CAP) progress.
