I. Overview

On December 3-5, 2024, the Correctional Medical Authority (CMA) conducted an on-site physical and mental health survey of Columbia Correctional Institution (COLCI). The survey report was distributed on January 14, 2025. In February 2025, COLCI submitted and the CMA approved, the institutional corrective action plan (CAP) which outlined the efforts to be undertaken to address the findings of the COLCI survey. These efforts included in-service training, physical plant improvements, and the monitoring of applicable medical records for a period of no less than ninety days. Items II and III below describe the outcome of the CMA's evaluation of the institution's efforts to address the survey findings.
