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I. Overview

On October 12-14, 2021, the Correctional Medical Authority (CMA) conducted an on-site physical and mental health survey of Lake City Correctional Facility (LCCF). The survey report was distributed on November 9, 2021. In December 2021, LCCF submitted, and the CMA approved, the institutional corrective action plan (CAP) which outlined the efforts to be undertaken to address the findings of the LCCF survey. These efforts included in-service training, physical plant improvements, and the monitoring of applicable medical records for a period of no less than ninety days. Items II and III below describe the outcome of the CMA’s evaluation of the institution’s efforts to address the survey findings.

IV. Conclusion

Physical Health

The following physical health finding will close: PH-2. One physical health finding will remain open.

Mental Health

The following mental health findings will close: MH-1, MH-4, & MH-8. All other mental health findings will remain open.

Until appropriate corrective actions are undertaken by LCCF staff and the results of those corrections reviewed by the CMA, this CAP will remain open. As some of the necessary steps to correct findings require further institutional monitoring, closure may take as long as three months. Follow-up assessment by the CMA will most likely take place through an off-site evaluation.
